- Veterans Day is a day when we celebrate and honor people who served in the United States Armed Forces. These brave and patriotic men and women are called veterans.
- We celebrate Veterans Day on November 11 of each year.
- At school, we may have special assemblies to show our thanks for veterans. Cities and towns may have a parade, or a formal event called a ceremony.
- The Veterans Day National Ceremony is held at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. At this ceremony, the President places a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. This is to honor those who died in service to our country, but whose names are not known.



### Ideas for Celebrating Veterans Day

- Talk with a veteran about their experiences.
- Make cards for veterans who are in a hospital or Veterans' home.
- Sing a patriotic song.
- Have a moment of silence at 11:00 a.m.
- Attend or participate in a parade.
- Make a poster.
- Visit a war memorial.








- Veterans Day is a day when we honor people who served in the United States Armed Forces. These men and women, called veterans, are celebrated for their patriotism and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the good of our country.
- We celebrate Veterans Day on November 11 of each year. This is because World War I officially ended at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month—11:00 a.m. on November 11th, 1918.
- Britain, France, Australia, and Canada also honor veterans on or near November 11.
- The Veterans Day National Ceremony is held at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. At this ceremony, the President places a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. This is to honor those who died in service to our country, but whose names are not known.
- As of 2014, there were 21.8 million veterans living in the United States. California, Texas, and Florida have the largest population of veterans.

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### What's the Difference Between Veterans Day and Memorial Day?




